- Triple Aim impact on NIshould be the focus of everything we do.






How NI Can "Step Up"

Change Examples


- o eCase Review

- Bundled Care
 - Help design workflows
 - o Nursing Advocate- this is often a physician driven process.
- Population Health
 - o Provide mobile devices and support mobile technology for patients
 - o Train nurses to use mobile tools
 - o Ochsner Health and use of Apple Watch
 - o Giving Patients tablets for education
 - o Predictive tools to identify patients at risk of Readmission

 - Reluctance to simplify
 - Sensitive to operations
 - o Commitment to resilience
 - o Defernce to expertise
